What is an Integrated Care System?

Integrated care is about giving people the support they need, joined up across local councils, the NHS and other key partners, including the voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) sector.

The Integrated Care System for York is the Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership.

What is an Integrated Care System?

- New or existing partnerships between organisations that meet health and care needs across an area
- Coordinated services
- Improve population health and reduce health inequalities
- Part of the NHS Long Term Plan

Integrated Care Systems become statutory bodies on 1 July 2022.

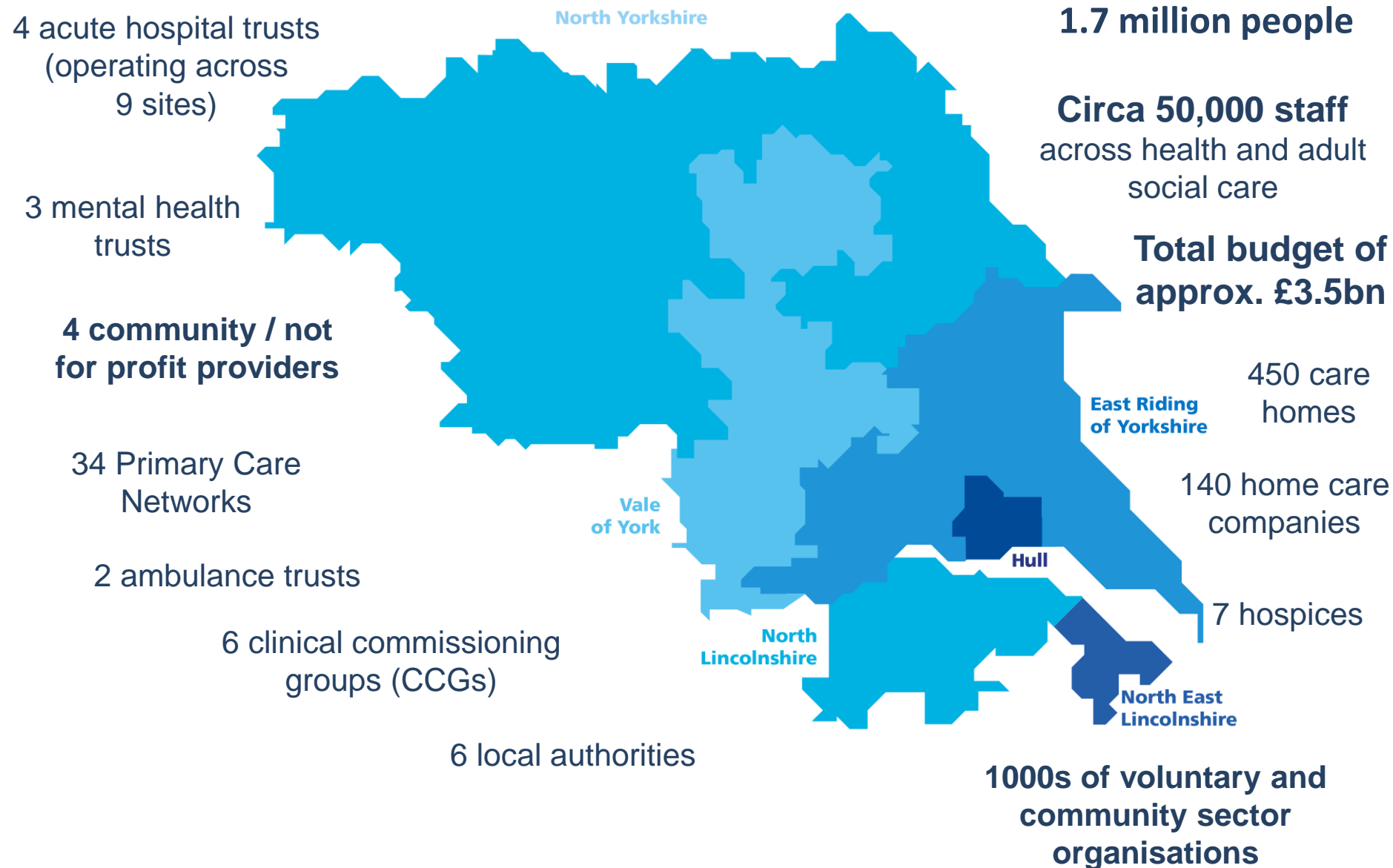
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Our ICS **Vision** is to ensure everyone in our area is able to:

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Acronyms...

Integrated care systems (ICSs) - are partnerships that bring together providers and commissioners of NHS services across a geographical area with local authorities and other local partners to collectively plan health and care services to meet the needs of their population.

Integrated Care Board (ICB) - an organisation with responsibility for NHS functions and budgets for the ICS

Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) - a statutory committee of the ICB bringing together all system partners to produce a health and care strategy

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The vision...

‘to **influence** and facilitate greater **collaboration** between the Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership and the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) Sector, **enhancing** the role of the VCSE sector in the delivery of the **transformation** of health and wellbeing and cementing their role as a **key strategic partner**’

VCSE Leadership Programme Outcomes



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- Create a **deeper understanding**, across all stakeholders, of the VCSE sector, how it operates and the impact it has on health and wellbeing at a system, place and neighbourhood level.
- Increase and build more **effective communications** to ensure both VCSE organisations understand the Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership priorities, and can access opportunities and the system is aware of the sector and what it can provide.
- The design of the health and care systems is informed by the changing needs of the population and health inequalities are reduced.

VCSE Leadership Programme Outcomes



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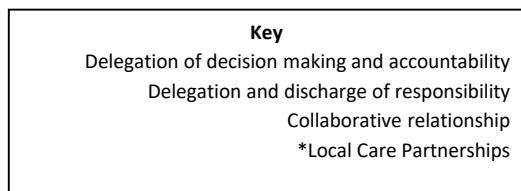
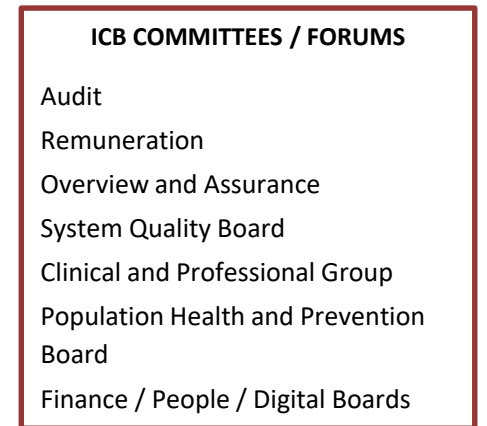
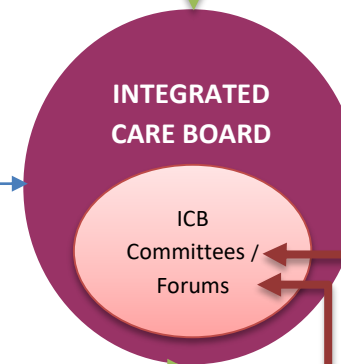
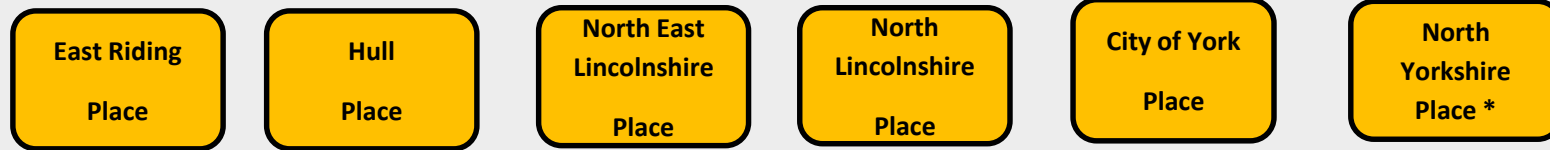
- **Deliver** against the health and care priorities at place as well as contributing to delivery against system wide priorities.
- Ensure the workforce of the VCSE sector is included in the system '**one workforce**' plan, utilising and sharing skills and learning and developing together.
- **Increase the investment** into the VCSE sector enabling organisations to deliver health and wellbeing services.

Connecting the VCSE sector at place...



- Designated VCSE senior lead in all six places.
- The role is designed to provide the link between the strategic role of the VCSE within the Integrated Care System and the work that is happening at place level within York.
- The focus is on creating opportunities for the wider sector at both Integrated Care System and Place level.
- Longer-term funding opportunities will come from both the system and place level engagement.
- Key principle is developing the VCSE as a trusted, confident and strong delivery partner.

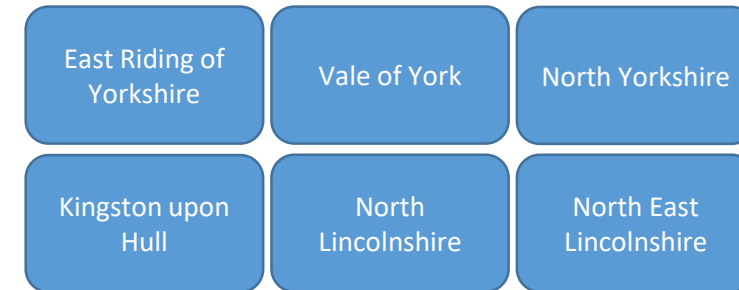

- Participation and engagement at a system and place level



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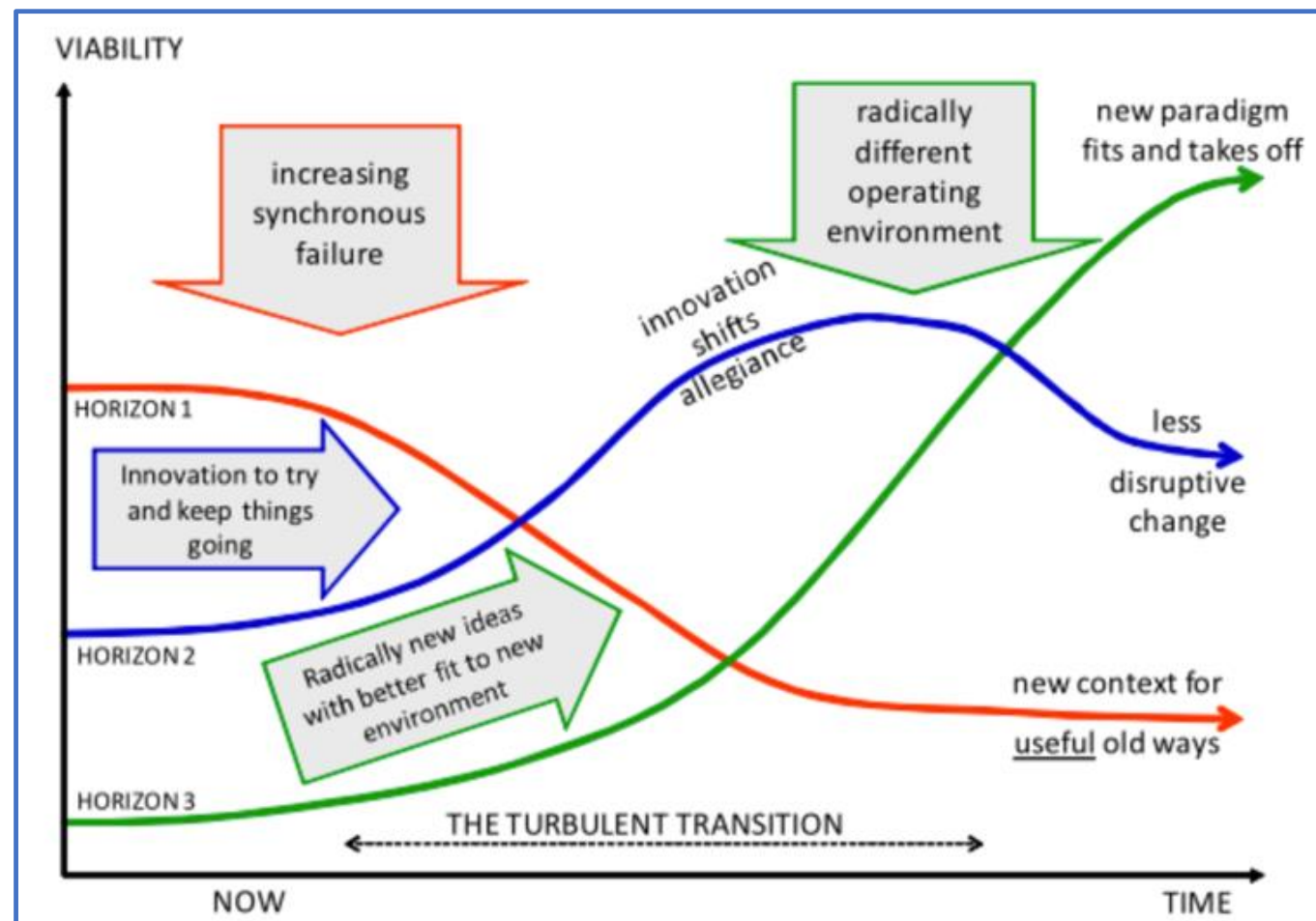

Strategic Inquiry Question 1

Where is the system now?

In November 2020 NHS England and NHS Improvement published Integrating care: Next steps to building strong and effective integrated care systems across England. It described the core purpose of an ICS being to:

- improve outcomes in population health and healthcare
- tackle inequalities in outcomes, experience and access
- enhance productivity and value for money
- help the NHS support broader social and economic development.
- **Are we working towards these now?**

Strategic Inquiry Question 2

Where does it need to be?

- What does an “integrated system” mean to you?
- What can we do together? What do we need to do separately
- What’s common, what’s unique?
- Can we and should we integrate our resources and pathways?
- What would help enable this? What’s in the way?

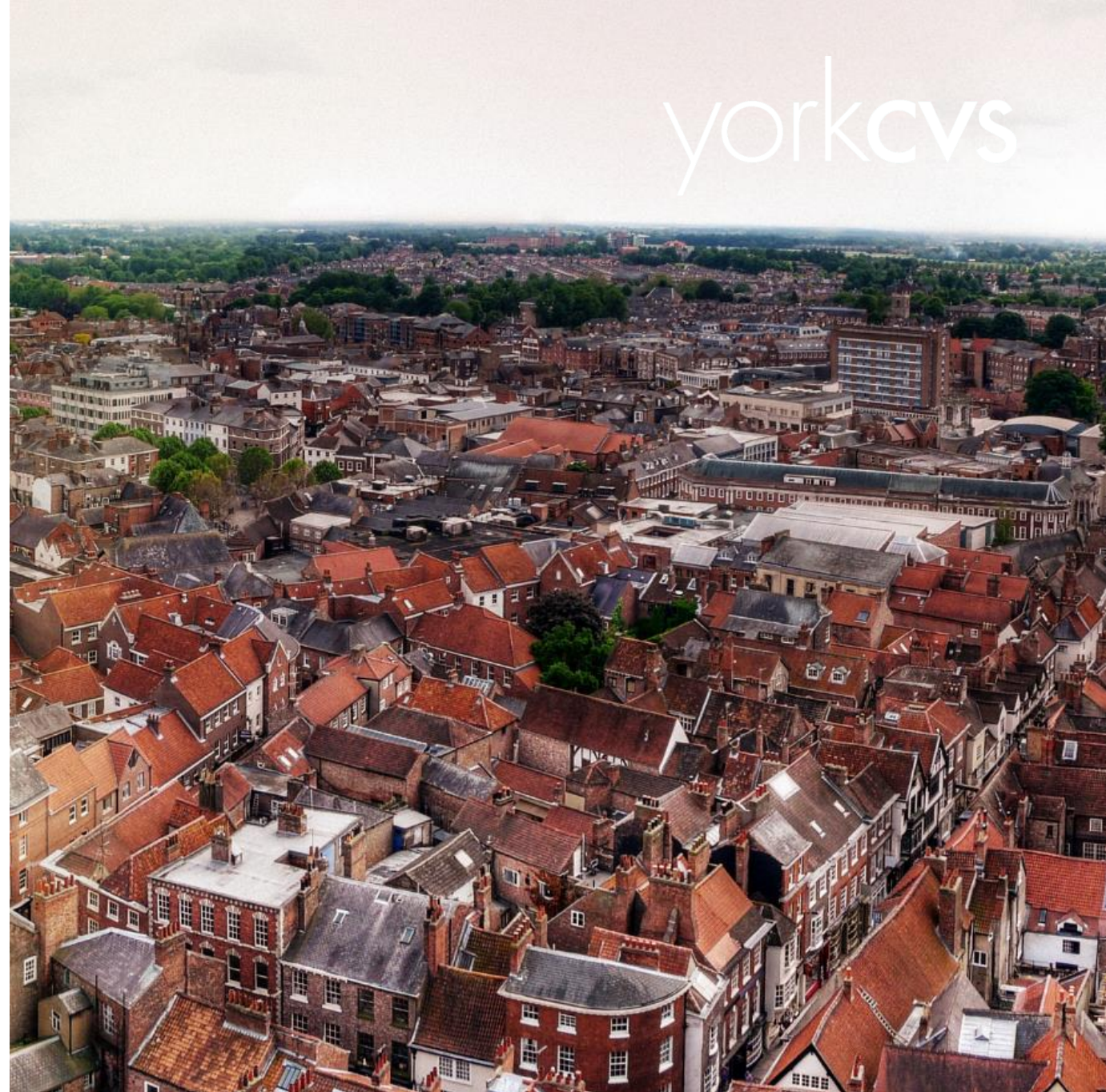

York VCSE Assembly



An inclusive collaborative of York VCSE groups and organisations, reflecting the diversity of the sector in terms of size, themes and geographic areas of delivery.

- Feeds into new place based structures as well as a wider ICS level VCSE Assembly
- Responding quickly and creatively to service delivery opportunities as and when they arise
- Coordinated communications and engagement
- Mechanism to agree future representation in new structures

York VCSE Assembly – Terms of Reference



Purpose:

To deliver a centralised mechanism for engagement with the wide voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) sector in York to maximise service development and delivery opportunities created by new place-based arrangements and the work of the developing Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership.

York VCSE Assembly – Terms of Reference



Objectives:

1. To support VCSE-VCSE Sector Collaboration
2. To support VCSE-Public Sector Collaboration
3. To lever in resource and facilitate investment
4. To build VCSE capacity
5. To facilitate representation

York VCSE Assembly – Terms of Reference



Meeting arrangements:

Formal VCSE Assembly meetings will be held on a monthly basis. The format of the meeting (i.e. face to face, virtual or hybrid) will be reviewed in line with guidance and consensus of feeling at the time.

York VCSE Assembly – Terms of Reference



Membership:

- Membership will be open to **all VCSE organisations** based and operating in the city of York or with beneficiaries in York.
- Organisations will be asked to complete a simple registration process.
- VCSE organisations that wish to attend Assembly meetings will be asked to send an appropriate representative who will commit to participate in discussions, make relevant decisions and give an overview of their group/organisation's work.
