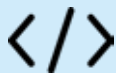

In 2024/2025...



136 people started digital skills training.



Two free Coder Dojo sessions were established for families (with a third coming in 2025/2026).



Volunteers were recruited to facilitate Coder Dojo sessions.



Over 50 free SIM cards were applied for and distributed to residents who cannot afford data.



Over 180 people attended digital drop ins in public spaces such as Explore.



106 people attended one off workshops and drop in sessions.



Focussed delivery was set up in digital deprivation areas including Central York, Clifton, Acomb and Fulford, with plans to expand into New Earswick, Tang Hall and Dringhouses.
